

# Care Opinion Newsletter January 2024



To date **45%** of stories have been told by our patients and **34%** by people who use our services.

Up to and including 31st January 2024 we have **299** stories shared on Care Opinion, which have been viewed on Care Opinion **28,639** times.

In total from the beginning, 89% of all of our stories have been positive and 11% allowing us the opportunity to learn and improve.

I recently presented to the AHP Directorate about our AHP journey on Care Opinion.

Collectively our AHP services have had **84** stories shared on Care Opinion, **almost a third** of all of our HSCP stories!. WOW and well done to all! ( ..and of course, everyone else!)

In **January** we had **26** stories shared on Care Opinion, which were viewed **856** times and **100%** of which were positive.

We have **237** members of which **195** are responders, 39 members and 3 administrators, up to and including 31st January.

To date **88%** of our authors have shared their story via the Care Opinion website.

This page demonstrates the incredible feedback P&K HSCP receives all thanks to the care and commitment you give.








The chart below shows how Care Opinion moderators have ranked the criticality of all our stories

#### The number of days from publication until the first response to these stories











## What we achieved in January

We had 26 stories shared on Care Opinion, which have been viewed 856 times.






In these charts, we see that for stories shared throughout January, 50% of the authors identified themselves as the patient, 42% as the user of the service. We also see that 96% of the stories were submitted via the Care Opinion website and 4% were shared by using the freepost leaflet and that Care Opinion moderators rated stories in January 88% positive and 12% mildly critical.
